October is Mission Month! Since 1926, Mission Month Local churches worldwide come together to celebrate and support the life-changing work of mission during October. This year, World Mission Sunday – the most significant day in Mission Month – is celebrated on the 21st October. World Mission Sunday collections will be taken up in every parish in the world, and used to help support missionaries to bring a message of peace to those who are suffering. The donations from these Masses worldwide will go to support churches, hospitals, schools and vocations in countries where the Church is too young or poor to support itself.

This Mission Month we're embracing the words of Pope Francis when he says all 'Christian Families are Missionary Families'. In fact, what better way to commemorate the recent World Meeting of Families than by using his words as the theme for Mission Month 2018! On Mission Sunday, Pope Francis is directly asking for you for your extra generosity. We too are asking and encouraging you to dig a little deeper and pray a little stronger so that faith, hope and love can spread to every corner of our planet.
