ANNUAL PIONEER & MATT TALBOT PILGRIMAGE TO KNOCK SHRINE 18TH JULY 2021 '

As you know, with current restrictions, capacity at Mass is very restricted and Knock Basilica is limited to a capacity of 200 people at present. Therefore, the Pilgrimage this year will be a virtual one. The Pilgrimage Mass will be streamed online www.knockshrine.ie/watch-live. Ceremonies will commence with the Rosary at 2.30pm.

In the late 60's Roadstone Cement Ltd bought a plot of land on Johnstown Road with the intention of building a concrete factory on the site. In response to this news a group of local women picketed the site and after some negotiation Roadstone donated the land to the residents on two conditions. Firstly it was to be used for the benefit of the whole community and secondly that it was not to be built on. In 1968 a number of local residents established The Cabinteely Centre Ltd as an umbrella organisation to oversee the management of the site. They then set up The Cabinteely Cultural and

Educational Centre, which any local resident could become a member of. This site was used for the first inauguration of the Cabinteely Boy Scouts and it was where they met for a short period of time. After this it was turned into a Pitch & Putt, for the use of the local community, which it continued to be for a number of years. For a period of time a Ladies Club, from Pottery Rd. and a Men's Club, from Sallynoggin, used Johnstown Pitch & Putt for their events. I am currently developing a project for the National Folklore Collection in University College Dublin around the history of the Johnstown Pitch & Putt site.
