# Feast of the Baptism of the Lord Year B-2024


#### Endings and Beginnings:

This weekend sees the end of the Christmas Season and we return to Ordinary Time with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, which marked the beginning of his ministry. St Mark will be our guide for most Sundays this year. Mark's Gospel is the shortest of the four and the first to be written.

Unlike Matthew and Luke, there's no mention of Bethlehem, shepherds or angels, wise men or kings in Mark's Gospel. The story begins with the adult Christ being baptised. Infancy stories were added later by the other writers; clearly Mark did not see them as important.

All four Gospels tell us about the baptism of Jesus and in all four it was a moment of revelation – an Epiphany - and a call to action, the beginning of his public life. This feast is linked to the feast of the Epiphany which we celebrated yesterday. The Magi recognised Jesus as the promised Messiah, the one who would be the Saviour; at his baptism Jesus had a similar moment of epiphany. a realisation of who he was and what he was called to do.

A voice came from heaven: 'you are my son, the beloved; my favour rests on you'. Clearly this is a key to understanding who Jesus is and to understanding what baptism is: it is a recognition that we are loved by God as his sons and daughters.
